Make this time with God's Word a special time for yourself.

REFLECT ON THE SCRIPTURE

What words or phrases were you drawn to when you read the scripture?

What are those words or phrases saying to you at this time?

How does it make you feel?

What do you feel prompted to do in response to this scripture?

RESPOND WITH PRAYER:

Who do you want to pray for?

What do you want to talk about with God?

Pray one decade of 1st, 2nd or 3rd Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary.

Respond with prayer in other ways that enable you to communicate with God.

DO SOMETHING:

Send a letter, note, voicemail, email or text to someone.

Contact someone who you think might be struggling, lonely or bereaved.

Tell someone how much you value them and why.

Light a candle for someone who does not yet know God or who cannot practise their faith for whatever reason and pray for them and keep them in your thought and prayers.

Light a candle for someone you know who has died or is ill or struggling - and keep them in your thoughts and prayers.

Create or make something which celebrates one of the gifts God has given you.

First reading: 2 Samuel 7:1-5,8-12,14,16

Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go and do all that is in your mind, for the Lord is with you.'

But that very night the word of the Lord came to Nathan:

'Go and tell my servant David, "Thus the Lord speaks: Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, to be leader of my

The Lord will make you great; the Lord will make you a House. And when your days are ended and you are laid to rest with your ancestors, I will preserve the offspring of your body after you and make his sovereignty secure. I will be a father to him and he a son to me. Your House and your sovereignty will always stand secure before me and your throne be established for ever.”

Second reading: Romans 16:25-27

Gospel: Luke 1:26-38

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so, the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.
