We gather

In the Gospel, St John tells us of when Jesus was preparing to return to his Father and was reflecting on all the work he had done on earth to spread the Good News.

It was at his last meal with the disciples.

Jesus was praying for his friends during his Last Supper with them. Jesus prayed to his Father, that his friends “may be one just as you and I are one.”

Before you listen to the Gospel take a moment to reflect on any times in the past week when you have not followed Jesus’ way and have been unkind, or not thoughtful of others in your family and say sorry.

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke (24:13-35)

After Jesus finished saying this, he looked up to heaven and said, “Father, the hour has come. Give glory to your Son, so that the Son may give glory to you. For you gave him authority over all humanity, so that he might give eternal life to all those you gave him. And eternal life means knowing you, the only true God, and knowing Jesus Christ, whom you sent. I have shown your glory on earth; I have finished the work you gave me to do. Father! Give me glory in your presence now, the same glory I had with you before the world was made.

“I have made you known to those you gave me out of the world. They belonged to you, and you gave them to me. They have obeyed your word, and now they know that everything you gave me comes from you. “I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those you gave me, for they belong to you. All I have is yours, and all you have is mine; and my glory is shown through them. And now I am coming to you; I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world. Holy Father! Keep them safe by the power of your name, the name you gave me, so that they may be one just as you and I are one.”

- **LEGO /Duplo Bricks Prayer**



You will need: Some Duplo or Lego bricks

Hold the brick you have chosen.

Pray for yourself. Thank God for the things he has given you. Ask Him to bless you and to help you to bless others.

Count the bumps on your brick.

For each bump on your brick, pray for a different person-friends or family and ask God to bless them this week.

Look at the different bricks your family are holding

Thank God for making each person special. Thank him for the things that are different but special about other people. Pray that we will learn how to celebrate and understand people who are different to us.

Find another brick with the same number of bumps as you have.

Thank God for families and friends and all who care for us.

Put all of the bricks together and build a structure or tower with them.

Thank God for the church and the communities we live in. Pray that He will help us to include others and to help people know that they are loved and valued.
