Resolving Conflict and Fixing Friendships is what Jesus is talking about in today's reading from Matthew 18:15-20. Remind your children that sometimes we need outside help to fix things. It might take effort, but we want to do everything we can to fix friendships and be friends with each other.

You could read this together, or you could paraphrase this. With older children you could talk about what you think Jesus is saying here. With younger ones focus on the last few lines: God answers those who talk to him, and when we gather together to pray He is with us.

'If your brother or sister does something against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the he or she listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the she or he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax-collector.

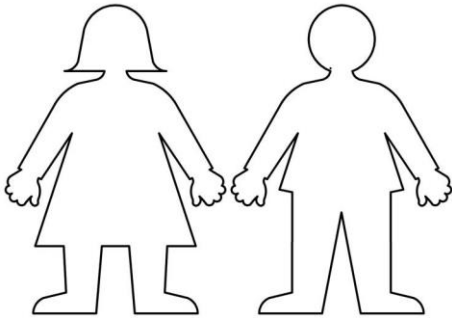
