We gather

In the Gospel, St. Matthew recounts parables told by Jesus to help us understand.

Today the Gospel is a parable about what the Kingdom of Heaven is like.

Listen carefully to the Gospel and find out how from something small – something amazing can happen.

We listen

The Gospel

There are some choices about how to listen to the Gospel together.

- You can watch the video of Kathryn reading the story
- One person can read the whole story on the sheet or from your own bible or missal

Before we listen to the Gospel -celebrate its message by singing

The Gloria and Alleluia –

This Gloria can be sung to the tune (Oh we can play the big bass drum)

Oh, we can give glory to the Lord

And this is the way we do it:



Clap, clap, clap with our hands, praise God And that's the way we do it Oh, we can give glory to God And this is the way we do it: Stamp, stamp, stamp with our feet, praise God And that's the way we do it.

This acclamation can be sung to the tune "Twinkle Twinkle, little star"

Jesus told them another parable: "The Kingdom of heaven is like this. A man takes a mustard seed and sows it in his field. It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it grows up, it is the biggest of all plants. It becomes a tree, so that birds come and make their nests in its branches."

We reflect


- Why do you think Jesus tells us stories or parables rather than just saying exactly what God's Kingdom is like, or exactly what it is he wants us to do?
- What does this parable tell us about God's Kingdom? Jesus wanted us to understand that although something may seem small and unimportant it can become something big and very important. Jesus began with only a few disciples/ followers and from these small beginnings there are now Christians throughout the world.
- (A small mustard seed grows into a tree that can be between 2 metres to 6 metres tall and 6 metres wide!!



What small things can you do to build the Kingdom? E.g. an act of kindness, a message of love to someone who is sad or lonely, forgiving someone who has hurt or upset you Can you think of 5 small things to do this week that builds God's Kingdom – Draw a beautiful tree with birds in it – write up the



trunk the 5 things you will do and tick them off when you do it-
